A room with high light often has southern or western facing windows that receive light for 6 or more hours a day. A high light room could also have a large eastern window and many lights that are on for most of the day.

| <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Croton- their bright colors remain vibrant in high light• Philodendron-versatile plants that can take a range of light• Anthyrium- more likely to re-flower in high light• Lipstick plant-fantastical blooms• Kalanchoe-waxy or fuzzy leaves• Succulents- such as echeveria, crassula, haworthia, aloe vera• Pilea-makes babies for sharing | <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Palms- such as areca, cardboard, kentia, and ponytail• Ficus elastica- a ficus variety that doesn't want direct sun• Euphorbia 'Firesticks'-most euphorbia varieties thrive in bright conditions• Dracaena- especially variegated• Cactus- let's not forget our spikey friends! |

❖ Remember, that high light is different from direct light. Many plants can sunburn in direct light and need to be slowly acclimatized to the sun's rays.
