Houseplants for High Light

A room with high light often has southern or western facing windows that receive light for 6 or more hours a day. A high light room could also have a large eastern window and many lights that are on for most of the day.

The Plants

- Croton- their bright colors remain vibrant in high light
- **Philodendron**-versatile plants that can take a range of light
- **Anthyrium** more likely to reflower in high light
- Lipstick plant-fantastical blooms
- Kalanchoe-waxy or fuzzy leaves
- Succulents- such as echeveria, crassula, haworthia, aloe vera
- Pilea-makes babies for sharing

- Palms- such as areca, cardboard, kentia, and ponytail
- Ficus elastica- a ficus variety that doesn't want direct sun
- Euphorbia 'Firesticks'-most euphorbia varieties thrive in bright conditions
- **Dracaena** especially variegated
- Cactus- let's not forget our spikey friends!



* Remember, that high light is different from direct light. Many plants can sunburn in direct light and need to be slowly acclimatized to the sun's rays.
